1 - President and Secretary General activities (reference period: Nov 20, 2022 – Oct 31, 2023)

This "Annual Report 2023" includes and summarizes the activities performed by the CoB President (CoB PR) and Secretary General (CoB SG) in the <u>period</u> following the 31st Members' Meeting (12-13 November 2022, Bologna - Italy, EIMA International 2022) and the October 31, 2023, a few days before the the 32nd Club of Bologna Members' Meeting (12-13 November 2023, Hannover - Germany, Agritechnica 2023).

As usual, these tasks were carried out in close collaboration with **Federunacoma** and have been focused on the following **main topics**:

- 1. General management and contacts with Members
- 2. CoB activities dissemination; website management and improvement
- 3. Management Committee (MC) meetings organization
- 4. 32nd Members' Meeting organization.

1.1 - General management and contacts with Members

These actions mainly concerned:

- after-meeting updating of the **members database** (outgoing and incoming members)
- members database management (membership monitoring, meetings' annual attendance, etc.)
- internal exchanges (CoB PR CoB SG Federunacoma) and contacts with club members mainly by email:

For each internal meeting the CoB SG writes a **short minute of reminders** of the aspects discussed or the decisions taken.

In addition, in order to better organize the Agenda, the interventions and coordinate the topics treated during 32nd Members' Meeting in Hannover, **n.4 online meetings** were carried out both with the Coordinators&Chairmen of the three Sessions of the 32nd Members Meeting (S1: D. Monarca; S2: A. Munack; S3 P. Schulze-Lammers) and with the related Key-Note Speakers.

1.2 - CoB activities dissemination; website management and improvement

1.2.1 Articles on specialized journals/magazines

Thanks to the **Rapporteurs** of the 2022 CoB meeting¹, the "**Session Reports**" have been produced. Subsequently, the CoB SG uploaded these three reports to the CoB site (https://www.clubofbologna.org/en/meetings-proceedings.php?ANNO=2022).

1.2.2 Members' Card Project

The "Members Card", which aims to increase the visibility of the specific skills of the "Club of Bologna" through the scientific and professional experience of its members, can be considered finished and must now only be fed with the information requested and coming to the new CoB Members.

Each new FM, in the official letter of admission to the CoB, is infact required to fill online the "**Input Fom**" that allows to CoB SG the generation of "Member Card".

Currently, for **86 Members** (on the 100 in total) the **information set was completed**. Many Members have also provided the list of their most significant **publications**, allowing visitors to the CoB website the use of the <u>search engine</u> (search by "Research Areas and Topics»).

Unfortunately, some FM – despite several reminder emails made by SG – **never compiled the** "Input Form" refreshing information. Consequently, for these FM - who ignored this important CoB activity - the "Member Card" – before the end of 2023 - will be reduced at the lowest level, leaving online basic information only.

The results of the Project and the possibilities deriving from the consultation of the different skills/knowledges of each CoB Member must now be illustrated to the machinery manufacturers affiliated to Federunacoma.

In this sense, the **database** built-up with the Project **on specific skills in the field of agricultural mechanization is unique in the world**.

1.2.3 Linkedin Group Project

During 2022, the proposal (by Marco Ramm) to create a CoB Social Group on social media "Linkedin" was approved to improve the Club visibility, its members, proposals and documents.

The project "Linkedin CoB Group" had a first development step. The CoB SG organized – on May **15, 2023** - with the presence of Patrizia. Menicucci (Administrative CoB Secretary - Federunacoma), Danilo Monarca (Coordinator SGR Dissemination) and Marco Ramm (Full Member), an online meeting to start the discussion about this project, and related rules and organization.

Following the results achieved during the meeting and from which a second Project step will start:

- administrators have been defined: P. Menicucci (Federunacoma); D. Monarca (SG Dissemination Coordinator); M. Ramm (Full Member) and M. Fiala (CoB SG)
- a first approach for structure and organization was defined: <u>WHO</u> → Everybody can follow the profile (CoB FM or not). CoB FM can send information to Admininistrators, asking to be published and shared. A critical aspect could be that not all CoB Members have a Linkedin profile, but in order to encourage them to run the app, a letter of information and 2 min. demo video (how to follow, advantages, opportunities, etc.) could be prepared; <u>WHAT</u> → only fresh&quick news must be uploaded (i.e.: meetings, Pellizzi Prize Notice, Members info, new Members, everything concerning CoB activities, relevant agro-mechanichal news, agro-mechanichal international meetings, interesting papers/articles, relevant activities carried out by CoB member, like researches, incoming webinars and events, appointments etc., CoB history, previous meetings and Pellizzi Prize, links to 30-year videos); <u>WHEN</u> → a minimum editorial plan requests to publish at least 2-3 posts per month.
- finally, taking into account that not all CoB Members will have a Linkedin profile, a specific communication sign by SGR Dissemination Coordinator will be sent to all the CoB Members, explaining them the meaning of the Linkedin CoB Group and the related possibilities, as wel as, inviting them: (i) to open a Linkedin profile, (ii) follow the CoB page, (iii) collaborate in its life and circulation.

1.2.4 Study Groups (SGR)

All the Coordinators² have maintained contacts between the members of the n.**4** SGR and during the 32nd Members' Meeting will be reserved a slot to allow the Coordinators to illustrate the activities conducted.

SGR1 "Sustainable Agricultural Mechanization in Africa" (chaired and organized by Josse De Baerdemaeker), SGR2 "Dissemination" (chaired and organized by Danilo Monarca, SGR3 "Ethics of the future agricultural mechanization development" (chaired and organized by Peter Pickel) and SGR4 "Evaluation of the incentives for the improvement of the agricultural mechanization in the world" (chaired and organized by Emmanuel Hugo).

1.2.5 Website management and improving

The website of the "Club of Bologna" (see: <u>www.clubobologna.org</u>) has been continuously improved, with the goal to **increase its accessibility and usability and the number of information/documents that is possible to download**.

1.2.5.1 Ordinary activities

The main actions made during the period focused on:

- CoB 2023 Annual Report Uploading of the summary document concerning the CoB activities during 2022-2023 period, drawn up by the Secretary General (SG)³, also containing a series of membership statistics (see: <u>https://www.clubofbologna.org/en/documents.php</u>, year 2023);
- Proceedings 31st Members' Meeting Uploading of: (i) the KeyNote Reports (full text) discussed in Bologna 2022 meeting, (ii) the Author(s) presentations, and (iii) the Conclusions made by the Session's Chairmen (see: https://www.clubofbologna.org/en/meetings-proceedings.php, year 2022);
- News uploading of importants **event or information** concerning the life of the CoB and its Members.

The degree of visibility of the "Club of Bologna" web site has so far been illustrated through *Google Analytics* tool. However, the analysis methods of the Google app **were changed in July 2023**. Comparisons between 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 are therefore insignificant.

Briefly- during the reference period - for this "Annual Report" we can only underline:

- total number of sessions: 2.600
- visualized pages: 7.500 (i.e.: 2,9 pages/session)




Figure 1 – Distribution of connections to <u>www.clubofbologna.org</u> (Nov 20, 2022 – Oct 31, 2023).

- **geographical distribution of the connections** shows that more than 50% of them takes place from three countries (USA, Italy, China) (Figure 1)

1.2.5.2 Straordinary activities

The main non-routine actions made for CoB website during the period, concerned the "Members Card" final development (see § 1.2.2).

1.3 - Management Committee Meetings

1.3.1 MC online meetings

In agreement with Federunacoma, one online MC members meeting on April 14, 2023_was organized.

This meeting, - scheduled at a daytime acceptable to Members both from the Far East (Japan) and North America (USA) – had the **participation of 9 Members of the governing body of the Club**.

The SG drafted a **Minutes**, which he then sent (18 May 2023) to all MC Members via email, for eventual comments and remarks (see <u>Annex 1</u>)

No MC Member sent any comments and, therefore, the document can go to the approval during the MC Meeting in presence, on November 11, 2023.

1.4 - 31st Members' Meeting organization

1.4.1 Agenda and Session Chairmen

The **Agenda** of the 32nd Members' Meeting in Hannover (12-13 November 2023) was organized on the basis of the last MC Members' Meetings (i.e.: Bologna, Nov 2022; online April 14, 2023:

- SESSION 1 AGRICULTURAL USED AREA (AUA) DECREASE, WORLD POPULATION INCREASE, CLIMATE CHANGE: ROLE OF MECHANIZATION, with n.4 Key-Note Reports, chaired by Danilo Monarca (Italy), Rapporteur: Alireza Pourreza (USA)
- SESSION 2 PREDICTIVE AND LONG DISTANCE MAINTENANCE, with n.3 Key-Note Reports, chaired by Axel Munak (Germany), Rapporteur: Dana Choi (USA)
- SESSION 3 SPECIFIC MECHANIZATION: MACHINES FOR SUGAR BEET AND POTATO, with n.4 Key-Note Reports, chaired by Peter Schulze-Lammers (Germany), Rapporteur: Hao Han (USA).

Before the "Closing Session" there will be interventions by the Coordinators of the n.4 **Study Groups** to illustrate the activities carried out during the period; Finally, at the end of Session 2 (Sunday late afternoon) and the meeting (Monday afternoon), **Free Visits** to Agritechnica 2023 are also organized.

As usual, each "Session Rapporteur" on the basis of the Key-Note Reports presented at the Session, the subsequent discussion and the Key-Sentences collected among the participants⁴, will write a **brief** (2-3 pages) **Technical Report**. These reports, will be uploaded on the CoB website, within the Meeting's Proceedings.

Figure 2 – "Club of Bologna" composition.




Figure 3 – "Club of Bologna" Members' occupation.





Figure 4 – "Club of Bologna" world area representativeness.

2.2.2 Attendance to the Members' Meetings




Figure 5– 1989-2023 attendance: general figure (Note: BLG = Bologna; HAN = Hannover).

The **historical trend of the attendance** of the Members to the "Club of Bologna" Members' Meetings is showed in Figure 5.

In the last 5 years the number of Members who attend the annual meetings, rises from **39** (HNN 2017) **to 54** (BLG 2021).

The data of the 32nd Members Meeting are only **provisional**: the real attendance will be computed only at the end of the meeting. **If the pre-announced attendance will be confirmed, the Attendance Index** (AI = Participant CoB Members/ CoB Members) for this meeting will be **52%**, decreasing compared to recent years.

2.2.3 Individual Member Attendance Index

For the evaluation of the "**Individual Member Attendance Index** (IMAI)", the attendance to CoB Members' Meetings of each Member <u>over the last 5 and 10 years</u> is analyzed. The incoming 32nd meeting is not take into account, since the participation is "expected" and needs to be really verified.

The values delimiting the IMAI five classes are as follows⁵:

Due to the difficulties related to the SARS-Cov2, the <u>Absences</u> at the 2020-21 meetings (Bologna EIMA DIGITAL PREVIEW, online <u>and</u> Bologna EIMA INTERNATIONAL 2020-21), were not taken into account. On the contrary, the <u>attendance</u> (both online and in presence), are computed.

Applying the analysis to the **past 5** (2018-2022) and **10** (2013-2022) **years** CoB members' Meetings, the index situation is shown in (Table 3).


This particular organization of the "Club of Bologna" meetings makes this Club the **only worldwide think-tank** -- **specifically focused on agricultural mechanization and its evolution in the different Countries**.

Over a hundred Authors from all over the world have been interested in KNRs production.

The great majority of these KNRs have been uploaded to the Club website, grouped by year (<u>https://www.clubofbologna.org/en/meetings-proceedings.php</u>). This KNRs' set, undoubtedly, constitutes **one of the most important** <u>free</u> **documents collections worldwide related to Agricultural Machinery and Mechanization**.

All these contributions were coded in **11 different categories** (topics) and **Figure 6** shows their distribution.

Figure 6 – Topics grouped into 11 classes. The number indicates the rate covered during the CoB meetings (1988-2023).



The five top topics were:

- Agricultural mechanization in the world, 23%
 Advanced technologies & electronics. 16%
- Advanced technologies & electronics,
 Sustainable agriculture, food quality,
- Sustainable agriculture, food quality, 14%
 Machinery design & production, 13%
- Technology transfer in developing countries, 9%.

They give the idea of the capacity that the "Club of Bologna" demonstrated by addressing - in advance and with far-sightedness - innovative issues, which have subsequently become topical in the sector of world Agricultural Mechanization.

<u>President:</u> on Session 2asks Marco Pezzini if - as an alternative to Munack's attempts - he can find some Italian manufacturer to be eventually involved

<u>Renius</u>: on Session 2, if Munack and Pezzini's attempts fail, there may be a chance to invite a Fendt speaker

<u>Fiala</u>: on Session 2, asks Munack and Renius, if it is possible to have KNR titles more detailed and the Speakers' emails in order to keep contacts. <u>Renius</u>: considers the title as it is of Report S3.3 by Mariutti (Caterpillar) - already exhaustive.

Schueller: on Session 3, proposed to add an US expert on potato market (Keith Tinsey, President ASABE)

<u>President</u>: appreciates this last suggestion and asks John to contact Tinsey and check if he is available to come in person to Hannover, supporting travel expenses. He considers a KNReport presentation more profitable in presence than in remote connection.

<u>Renius</u>: stresses that it would be very important to include Grimme GmbH, who is the world's largest manufacturer of potato harvesting machines. He then suggests to involve Auernhammer because a present Grimme big-expert, was a his PhD student

Concerning the general title for the 32nd meeting:

After a brief comparison between the MC members, the following title is decided: "Agricultural Mechanization: Urgency for Food Security."

<u>President</u>: at the end of the topic of this point of the MC meeting agenda, hear and annotate the comments and observations of the Members of the Management Committee, asks puts to the vote what was discussed and decided. The Management Committee <u>approves unanimously</u>.

2.2. Sessions Rapporteurs: proposal and approval

<u>President</u>: remembers that in the last CoB Members' meetings editions the Pellizzi Prize winners were invites to act as "Session Rapporteur". He remembers also the Rapporteurs are asked to: (i) write – also

considering the Key Sentences written by the meeting participants - a "Session Report" (2-3 pages), to be used by Members to disseminate the CoB activities and conclusions; (ii) improve the Sessions discussion.

<u>President</u>: asks if the MC agrees to continue to involve the past Pellizzi Prize Winners, and then proposes as next Session Rapporteurs: (i) Session 1: Xin Zhang, USA; (ii) Session 2: Rajes Modi, India; Session 3: Hao Gan, USA

Schueller: suggests verifying if Dr. Zhang and Dr. Gan will not have problems with US Immigration Office; therefore proposes in alternative Dana Choi. He will check personally.

<u>President</u>: at the end of the topic of this point of the MC meeting agenda, hear and annotate the comments and observations of the Members of the Management Committee, asks puts to the vote what was discussed and decided. The Management Committee <u>approves unanimously</u>.

3 - MC meeting in presence on 11 November 2023 (Hannover)

<u>President</u>: first of all, invites all MC members to attend the meeting in Hannover, and about the topics to be discussed in the MC meeting of November 11, (5.00-7.30 pm, local time, Maritim Airport Hotel, room still to define), he highlights the following very important points:

- about members to cancel from the CoB FM list: proposes to continue to follow the well-established methodology that excludes inactive FM for at least 5 years
- about new FM, reiterates the opportunity to try to cover most of the world nations, with particular reference to African Countries. About that, he illustrates the current situation: America (North-South): 3 represented Countries (14 Members); Africa: 2 represented Countries (2 Members); Europe (West-East): 2 represented Countries (57 Members); Asia: 5 represented Countries (11 Members). President finally, he recommends to looking for contacts also with important Associations related to agricultural machinery, but also to sector strictly linked with the agriculture. For example:

- about the future MC Members (following the decision taken during the MC meeting of October 2021) remembers that the present CoB "Internal Rules" (<u>https://www.clubofbologna.org/en/internal-rules.php</u>) set out that the MC Members (excluding Past Presidents) will end their mandate by November 2024.

Concerning new FM proposals:

<u>Schueller</u>: Australia must be represented into the CoB and informs the MC members he will try to check if there is any expert to invite.

Singh: agrees with John (Schueller).

<u>Pezzini</u>: fully agrees on the involvement of all Associations, not only those closely related to agricultural mechanization but also those dealing - more generally - with the agri-food sector, particularly OCDE. He can keep contact with Fertilizers Europe and will report to the CoB President.

<u>President</u>: thanks the members for the effort in widening the Club and asks to send the proposals of new Members to Secretary General (joined by a CV) as soon as possible, so as to discuss them during the next MC meeting in presence to Hannover (Nov 11, 2023).

<u>President</u>: finally informs that, considering the replacement of Jerome Bandry as Secretary General of CEMA with **Jelte Wiersma**, it is necessary to carry on the substitution also into the CoB FM list. Mr. Jelte

Wiersma has sent his CV (which the CoB SG will send to all MC Members together with this report).

<u>President</u>: concerning the Mr. Wiersma appointment (as CEMA delegate), asks to the vote the proposal - presented by Marco Pezzini following the disposals of our "Internal Rules". The Management Committee <u>approves unanimously</u>; consequently, Jelte Wiersma is the new FM of the Club of Bologna and, as such, will be sent an "Official Nomination Letter" and will be invited to the next meeting in Hannover.

Concerning topics for 33rd CoB Members Meeting:

<u>President</u>: presents now some preliminary proposals of topics to be discussed in the next meeting (i.e.: 33rd CoB Members' Meeting (Bologna, 2024):

- Session 1: *The fourth Industrial Revolution, complex systems, and agriculture* (suggested by FM Fedro Zazueta with possible UNIDO Keynote Speakers)
- Session 2: General Open Discussion among the CoB Members about what they look forward for the CoB and which could be the future Members' contribution (suggested by MC member Axel Munack; eventually – as alternative solution - in form of <u>evening/after-dinner discussion</u>)
- Session 3: *Special Mechanization: machinery for hay making* (suggested by the President, under the Chairmanship of Prof. Fabrizio Mazzetto, University of Bozen Italy)

after that, he opens the discussion among MC Members.

<u>Renius</u>: considers the President's proposals to be good. He also suggests the topic "*First experiences with field-robots (terrestrial drones)*"

<u>Pezzini</u>: excellent the Karl (Renius) ide. He emphasizes the great relevance and timeliness and asks to pay also attention to the repercussions that the employment of the field-robots will have on the final users and to the level of formation and competences that will be necessary in order to be able to fully use such technology.

About Session 1:

<u>Singh</u>: considers the S1 very interesting. However, it should be organised in such a way that the contributions (i.e. Key Note Reports) contain not only theoretical aspects but also practical indications and technological aspects, discussing the repercussions in the different production systems.

<u>Schueller</u>: proposes therefore to mix the proposal presented by Fedro Zazueta with the of Karl's one.

Snobar: agrees with the proposal of John (Schueller) and suggests therefore to change the title of the S1.

About Session 2:

<u>Munack</u>: suggests to address this important topic as "*After-Dinner Discussion*". In this case, however, it will be necessary to organise the round table by defining a specific agenda to be followed in order to optimize the discussion and the results that will emerge.

About Session 3:

No remarks or comments.

4 - Update on the social group "CoB" on Linkedin

President: first, remember that Marco Ramm (Full Member of the Club) proposed to establish a Linkedin"CoB Group", by which disseminate the Club activitis and news. The same Marco Ramm declared his availability to coordinate this group on this well-known social platform.

<u>President</u>: informs that a meeting has recently been held with Federunacoma - in particular with Patrizia Menicucci who takes care of the communication aspects related to the CoB - to discuss specifically this interestig and innovative communication tool. During this meeting specific technical aspects emerged; the main ones were:

- Which are the content and the aims of the CoB Linkedin group: will it be a reserved space on which each CoB FM will be able to freely upload news and information that they consider to be of interest to the CoB comunity, eg local events, commercial information, etc.? or will it be an open-space devoted to agricultural mechanization?

<u>President</u>: proposes that the project continue with the direct involvement of Federunacoma (Patrizia Menicucci) and for CoB the Coordinator of the Study Group "Activities Dissemination" (Danilo Monarca). <u>President</u>: at the end of the topic of this point of the MC meeting agenda, hear and annotate the comments and observations of the Members of the Management Committee, asks puts to the vote what was discussed and decided. The Management Committee <u>approves unanimously</u>.
